Boatworks: Assist boat builders with various tasks needed in boat construction, restoration and maintenance.

Clerical: General Office-related duties such as typing, computer data entry, filing, answering phones, etc.

Curatorial: Assist curator in cataloguing, researching, updating & maintaining exhibits and collections.

Gift Shop: Assist staff with duties in Museum Gift Shop and Sea Haven Gallery with sales, stock and admissions.

Maintenance: Assist staff with various maintenance jobs such as painting, carpentry, etc.

Program Interpreter: Provide visitors with information on different exhibits and buildings throughout the site and on the history of the area.

Special Demonstrators: Sharing your knowledge and skills through demonstrations and explanation of a craft.
